DID YOU KNOW......

Note: Peoples Drug Store began in 1916 and operated for a hundred years. See the full article in the SHA Newsletter, Winter 2017

Ginnie Himelright Finfrock's work at Peoples spanned 45 years, from June 1971 to October 2016 when they closed. "We were very fortunate that some customers were lifelong; some customers in 2016 had been customers in 1971," said Ginnie. But some things changed. "In 1971, I went to work wearing a dress or skirt and blouse, dress shoes and stockings. In 2016 we could wear jeans and a t-shirt if we wanted to." Ginnie went on to say, "In the 70's, you'd get a case of something in the storeroom and it would be stocked on the shelves; in later years, an order would come every day. We might order one of something because it only took a day to get it." Ginnie remembers Peoples had "In house drug store charge accounts until 2003". "And in the 70's, we had a full service ice cream soda fountain." Peoples was a popular after school place to get ice cream or a soda. "Election day was very busy because people would take care of business while they were in town," said Ginnie. "How things progressed and changed. We used to hand record everyone's prescription on large index cards, and when we did a refill, we hand wrote it on the back of the card. The information on the pill bottle was typed on an electric typewriter. Codes for insurance billing were written by hand too."

"One thing that stayed constant was the personalized service and the way our customers were treated," Ginnie said. "In my opinion, I feel like we had good relationships with our customers. You weren't a number, you were a person. We had the willingness to go the extra step to make sure our customers got what they needed." That's what a small town drug store is all about. Good customer service, but more than that -- not only was Peoples Drug Store a small town business, it was a business where the staff knew the challenges their customers faced each day. When your customers are your neighbors and your classmates and those you sit beside in church or at the high school football game, you possess an understanding that you might not otherwise have. This is why Strasburg will forever hold Peoples Drug Store dear to its heart.

TRASH AND RECYCLING RECEPTACLES

In order to help make trash and recycling collection days run smoothly, please be sure all trash is in the proper type of container. Garbage containing animal (meat) or vegetable matter needs to be in an **airtight** metal or plastic container, not weighing more than 30 pounds. All trash that will not decay or ferment (paper, etc.) can be in any kind of receptacle and should not weigh more than 50 pounds. Containers should only be filled level with the brim. Recycling containers should be labeled with a "RECYCLING" label which can be obtained at the Town Office. All trash and recycling should be placed out for collection before 7 a.m. on collection day and not before noon on the day before.

TALL GRASS

Grass is growing and mowing season is here! Please, keep in mind -----

- It is the property owner's responsibility to mow and maintain their lawn and the height of grass should not exceed eight (8) inches.
- Properties whose grass exceeds eight (8) inches will receive only ONE NOTICE of violation for the entire year before the Town cuts your grass and sends you a bill.
- Lawn maintenance is very beneficial!
 Mowing height and frequency will determine how healthy and attractive your lawn looks.
- Violations can be reported through your mobile device with a free mobile app, Your GOV.
