

DEDICATION OF HISTORICAL HIGHWAY MARKER

The small community of Fishers Hill will soon have a new highway marker placed along Route 601 (Battlefield Road) to commemorate three women who achieved national prominence for their creative endeavors, but were later largely forgotten. Those being honored on this marker include landscape painter **Bertha Von Hillern** (ca. 1857-1939), once renowned as a competitive endurance walker, who shared a studio with painter **Maria J. C. a' Becket** (1839-1904). **Emma Howard Wight** (ca. 1863-1935) arrived in the Fishers Hill area late in the 1880's and became a prolific author of novels, short stories, plays, radio dramas, and photoplays.
