DID YOU KNOW......THE UNIFIED DEVELOPMENT ORDINANCE IS GOING THROUGH A REWRITE!

Planning & Zoning Administrator Otis is currently in the process of rewriting the Unified Development Ordinance (UDO) and making it more user friendly. The Town has contracted with the Berkley Group to facilitate workshops, open to the public, where interested parties can address any concerns related to the existing zoning ordinance and say what they would like to see moving forward.

Meetings will be held on **Monday, June 12, and Thursday, July 13**. Both meetings will be held at Strasburg High School Cafeteria and will be from 5 p.m. – 7 p.m.

LOVE SIGN

With over 300 installations, the LOVEworks program is a state-wide initiative designed to promote travel and tourism in Virginia and strengthen awareness of the

"Virginia is for Lovers" brand messaging. Strasburg's new LOVEworks design consists of four 3' x 4' pieces of painted sheet metal, cut by Dennis Johnson, mounted to the industrial pedestrian bridge on the southeast corner along the Town Run in Strasburg Square. These letters combine our Germanic roots and vibrant character with the use of Fraktur designs, painted by local artist Barbara Plitt. Barbara, who designed the installation, "sought to bring together a nod to the Town's German heritage and her love of color, which brings joy to so many." Fraktur designs often represent the rural surroundings and beliefs of the Pennsylvania Germans who made them. Lively drawings and intricate lettering are basic features of most Fraktur with popular images including birds, hearts, and flowers. Come Discover the Different Sides of Strasburg.

PROPERTY IMPROVEMENTS AND CONTRACTOR SCAMS – BEWARE!

Please be aware, if you hire a contractor to perform work on your property, as the property owner, you are ultimately responsible for ensuring all permits are obtained.

Citizens have had contractors perform work that is noncompliant, and the contractor does not obtain permits. Per the Code of Virginia, any zoning violations are to be issued to and are the responsibility of the property owner. This leaves the property owner responsible for the removal of any noncompliant construction.

Please, keep in mind, any issues between the property owner and contractor are civil matters and should be addressed in the courts and not through the Town's zoning office.

To protect yourself from these contractor scams, we recommend that prior to beginning improvements, you identify if a permit is required. If one is required, be sure one is obtained. 
