BEAR SIGHTINGS

Periodically, the town receives phone calls about bears being seen in neighborhoods. Here are a few tips from the Virginia Department of Game and Inland Fisheries that might help to keep the bear population away from your back yard. Remember, it is up to you to change your behavior to avoid having a bear visit.

- Bird feeders, garbage, beehives, and pet food are the most common food attractants. Don't allow the bear to become comfortable on your property!
 - Remove bird feeders between April and November to help deter bears.
 - o Secure garbage cans in a shed or garage.
 - Feed only what your pet will eat in a single feeding or feed inside; remove uneaten food.
- Use harassment techniques along with removing items that attract bears.
- Talk to your neighbors and ask that they discourage bears by removing the attractants.
- If you see a bear on your property, respect the bear's space and stay away. If it is in a tree, leave it alone and keep your pets away so it will leave on its own.

Never deliberately feed a bear. We all need to work together to keep bears wild. For more information, please visit: www.dgif.virginia.gov/wildlife/bear/ or contact the Wildlife Conflict Helpline at (855) 571-9003.

PAYMENT OPTIONS FOR UTILITY PAYMENTS

All of us sometimes forget to pay a bill. The Town of Strasburg offers "Auto Draft" for your utility bill. Here is how it works:

- Sign up at the Town Office (174 E. King Street) or call (465-9197) or check our website (www.strasburgva.com) for a form.
- Your payment will automatically be deducted from your bank account on the due date.

Other payment options are also available. Credit cards are accepted at the counter for utility bills. In addition, utility bills and taxes can be paid online using Official Payments (a small fee will apply for online payments). On the town's website, click on the "Official Payments" link and follow the directions given. The Town's jurisdiction code is "9004".
